Scholarship Criteria

Scholarships offered through the OSU-Cascades Campus Foundation are for admitted degree-seeking students at OSU-Cascades, who have a 2.50 GPA or higher, and are enrolled in a bachelors degree program. Most scholarships require full-time (12 credits) attendance each term. *Scholarships awarded to juniors and seniors require enrollment in at least one OSU or UO course at Cascades each term.*

Evaluation of the scholarship application information will be done by a committee composed of faculty, community members and OSU-Cascades staff. Most scholarships are awarded for one academic year and students must re-apply each year; some scholarships are automatically renewable if the conditions of the award are met by the student. Most scholarships range from \$300 to \$1000 per academic term. Students enrolled in OSU-Cascades degree programs can apply for scholarships in the following areas:

Cascades Diversity: Junior standing and admitted to OSU-Cascades, demonstrated ability to contribute to a diverse campus community, demonstrated financial need.

Cascades Partner: Junior standing and admitted to OSU-Cascades, demonstrated contribution to Central Oregon community, demonstrated financial need.

Cascades Scholar: Junior standing and admitted to OSU-Cascades, cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher.

Cascades Mini-Grant: Admitted to OSU-Cascades.

Cascades Community: Other scholarships may be available to students with specific eligibility requirements. Check the OSU-Cascades website: www.osucascades.edu/scholarships for complete descriptions of each scholarship.

Application Steps

- Apply for **Admission to OSU-Cascades**.
- Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov and provide a copy of your 2009-2010 **Expected Family Contribution (EFC)**.
- Read the scholarship application carefully and complete the entire application.
- The **Insight Resume Section** of this application is required. OSU-Cascades would like to better understand your perspectives, contributions, qualifications, and diverse talents.
- The **Narrative Section** of this application is also required. Tell us about your activities, awards and employment.
- Submit a copy (official or unofficial) of your most **Current Academic Transcripts**
- Letters of Recommendation** are not required, but can help the scholarship committee more fully understand your strengths and talents.
- REMEMBER:** Incomplete applications will not be considered. Remember to sign your application, include your EFC (Expected Family Contribution) and submit a copy (official or unofficial) of your most current academic transcripts.

Financial Need

While not all OSU-Cascades scholarships are dependent upon financial need, most include a financial need assessment. In order to accurately assess student financial need, we **require an official Expected Family Contribution (EFC)**. The EFC is calculated by the Department of Education after processing your FAFSA. Enter the EFC from your 2009-2010 Student Aid Report (SAR) and attach a copy of the page showing your EFC. You may request a duplicate copy by calling 1-800-433-3243. If you have a PIN from the Department of Education, you can access the information on the internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you need a PIN, you may request one at www.pin.ed.gov.

OSU-Cascades would like to better understand your perspectives, contributions, qualifications, and diverse talents. Please highlight your experiences in each category keeping in mind that what you know could contribute to the future community of excellence at OSU-Cascades. Respond to each of the six questions and limit answers to 100 words per question.

- 1. Leadership/group contributions:** Describe examples of your leadership experience in which you significantly influenced others, helped resolve disputes, or contributed to group efforts over time. Consider responsibilities to initiatives taken in or out of school.
- 2. Knowledge in a field/creativity:** Describe any special interests and how you have developed knowledge in these areas. Give examples of your creativity- the ability to see alternatives; take diverse perspectives; come up with many, varied, or original ideas; or willingness to try new things.
- 3. Dealing with adversity:** Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to address this challenge. Include whether you turned to anyone in facing the challenge, the role the person played, and what you learned about yourself.
- 4. Community service:** Explain what you have done to make your community a better place to live. Give examples of specific projects in which you have been involved over time.
- 5. Handling systemic challenges:** Describe your experiences facing or witnessing discrimination. Tell us how you responded and what you learned from these experiences and how they have prepared you to contribute to the OSU-Cascades community.
- 6. Goals/task commitment:** Articulate the goals you have established for yourself and your efforts to accomplish these. Give at least one specific example that demonstrates your work ethic/diligence.

Extracurricular Activities

- 7. Extracurricular Activities:** List school and community service activities in which you have participated. Indicate positions held (if any), hours per week devoted to each activity, and the years of participation.

Awards, Honors, Recognition

- 8. Awards:** List awards, honors, or special recognitions you received during high school or college.

Employment

- 9. List paid employment positions** you have held, number of hours worked per week, and the years of employment.
