2008-2009 Advising Guide for International Degree

Admission Requirements:

- At least 32 credits of college-level coursework with a cumulative GPA of 2.75.
- Proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to 203/213 with a cumulative GPA of 3.0

Degree Requirements:

- International Degree cannot be awarded unless the student also earns another OSU undergrad degree considered primary degree.
- Minimum 32 credits hours in-residence beyond credit hours required for primary degree.

Total number of credits: 180 primary degree + 32 international degree = 212 credits

Credits in residence: 45 primary degree + 32 international degree = 77 credits in residence

This means that 77 of your credits MUST be in residence

Courses taken through OSU-sponsored program abroad are considered in-residence credits.

- Must complete the 1 credit seminar course – International Issues: Intro to Thesis.
- Foreign language courses must be taken for grade, minimum 3.0 GPA in foreign language courses

Important Notes:

- Additional International Degree requirements may be established for your primary degree. See your department for information.

International Degree Overview:

The International Degree allows you to become an expert in an international context of your subject, putting you a step ahead of most of your peers in language skills, research and writing experience, and intercultural experience, communication and understanding. Students who complete the International degree will receive a BA in International Studies in their primary major. For example: A student receives a BS in Liberal Studies and a BA in International Studies in Liberal Studies.

Graduates of the International Degree program can deliver hard proof of additional qualities, including an understanding of your discipline in a global context, as well as confidence, intellectual and cultural curiosity, flexibility, self-discipline, and independence, among many others!
