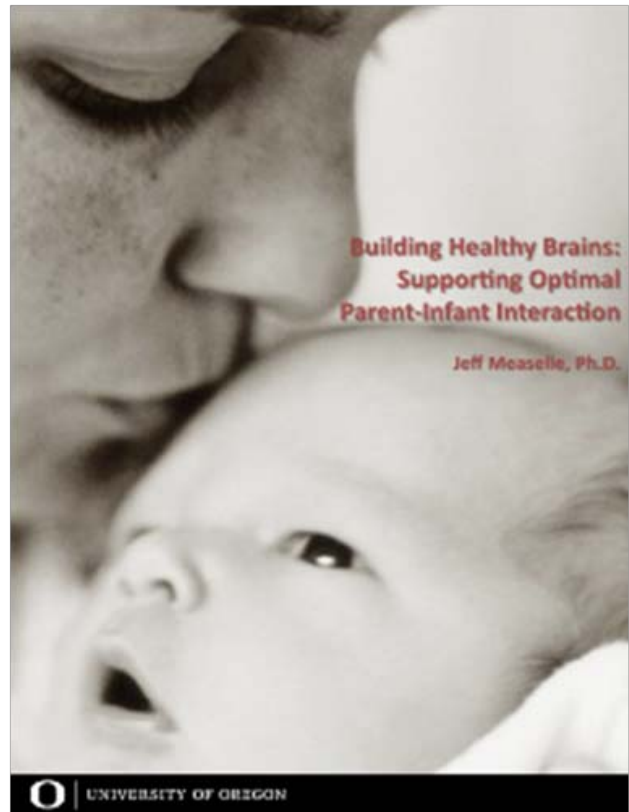


Building Healthy Brains: Supporting Optimal Parent-Infant Interaction

Jeffrey R. Measelle, Ph.D. is an Associate Professor of Developmental and Clinical Psychology, and is the Director of Clinical Training in Psychology at the University of Oregon. His research investigates familial neurobiology, specifically, how infants' and young children's biological and psychological characteristics interact with their social environments to predict the emergence of behavioral and emotional health and dysfunction. Funding for this work comes from the MacArthur Foundation, National Institutes of Health, and the National Science Foundation. With Dr. Jennifer Ablow, he co-directs the Infant Mental Health Program at the University of Oregon.
