BI 406:Field Studies: Natural History and Ecology of the Oregon High Desert

This course will explore the high desert of Southeastern Oregon in order to better understand and appreciate this wild and beautiful area. This will include studying the life history, adaptations, and ecology of the region's distinctive flora and fauna; natural processes and events that shaped the land; prehistoric and historic geography of the Great Basin; and land and resource management and conservation issues in the sage steppe.
