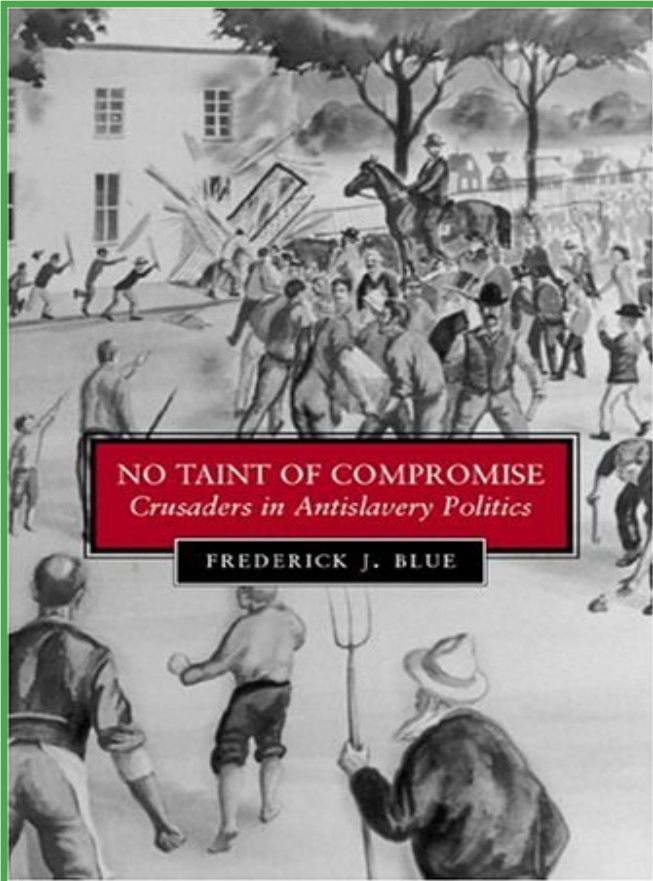
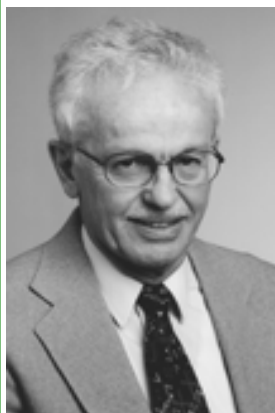


# Crusaders in Antislavery Politics



Professor Blue's lecture will be an account of the trials and accomplishments of eleven men and women who, in the face of great odds and powerful opposition, insisted that emancipation could be achieved only through the political process. They rejected the anti-politics stance of William Lloyd Garrison and, working through the Liberty, Free Soil, and Republican parties, eventually overcame the opposition of what they called the Slave Power to achieve abolition during the Civil War. This topic is covered in his book, *No Taint of compromise: Crusaders in Antislavery Politics*, which just came out in paperback.
