### Curricular Updates

#### 2007-2008 Academic Year

**HDFS** is making several curriculum changes that may mean changes to your plan of study. Be aware that:

1. **HDFS 460: Social Policy** is cancelled and will not be required for HDFS students for the 2007-2008 academic catalog. If you already took HDFS 360, than add one of the following distance education courses as an equivalent course to HDFS 460:

If you have not yet taken HDFS 360, do not worry, as the content from HDFS 460 is being absorbed into HDFS 360: Critical Thinking (4 credits) and HDFS 361: Research Methods (4 credits).

2. HDFS 361: Research Methods is now required for all HDFS students. **Note.** 4 credits of statistics is required as a pre-requisite for HDFS 361 for all HDFS students. This affects early childhood development and education students the most, as you have to take statistics in addition to Math 211 and Math 212 (note. Math 213 is optional). I recommend taking Math 243 at COCC or Statistics 201/209 from OSU E-Campus (distance education). All Human Service and Gerontology students will still need Math 243 *and* Math 244 or a total of 4 credits of statistics (Statistics 201 and Statistics 209) before they take HDFS 361: Research Methods, which is offered each spring.

2. All students will now be required to take **HDFS 311: Infant and Child Development** (4 credits). If you took HDFS 465: Infant and Child Development *and* HDFS 407 1 credit or if you are in the catalog year before 2007-08, then do not worry (i.e., you were admitted into OSU-CC HDFS program prior to Spring 2007). If not, be sure HDFS 311 is on your plan of study for fall term 2007. Psych 235: Infant and Child

Development from COCC will no longer be accepted as an equivalency course, as this course is only **3 credits** and lower division.

3. All human development and family development courses will now be 4 credits (HDFS 311, HDFS 313, HDFS 314, and HDFS 341): Be sure to adjust your plan of study accordingly, and recheck that you have **60 300 and 400 level credits (Upper Division) before graduation.**

4. **HDFS 444** is changed from Child Abuse and Neglect to **Family Violence Across the Life Span**, and will also be 4 credits (offered each winter term).

The biggest change is the elimination of HDFS 460: Social Policy and the addition of HDFS 361: Research Methods as a required course.

Double check that you will have 180 credits overall before graduation, and double check that you will have all major requirements, baccalaureate requirements, and 60 credits of upper division. Double check again. Thank you.
