 - Interested students contact COEC to discuss details of specific positions. This is also a good time for students to meet with their advisors reg
 - ments and credit registration.
 - COEC forwards students' contact information to the Member Group(s) most appropriately matched to the students' interests, area of study ar
 - The Member Group(s) then contacts the students to set up interviews.
 - Students begin the internship with sponsoring Member Groups.
 - COEC checks in on students and Member Groups to offer support and monitor the program throughout the term. At the end of the internship
- interview with each student to get feedback on the internship project and search for ways to continuously improve our program.
