Working toward your Psychology degree consists of the Major requirements, Bacc Core requirements, CLA Core Requirements, BA or BS requirements. The following document has info on each of the above.

OSU Graduation Requirements:

- 180—total number of credits required to graduate from OSU
- 60—number of upper division credits required
- 124—maximum number of credits which can be transferred from a community college
- 45 of last 75 credits must be OSU credits
- Maintain a 2.0 or better university GPA

Only courses with grades of C- or better (S/U is not acceptable) may be used to fulfill the major requirements

Important Notes:

IMPORTANT: Courses may NOT be used to meet more than one requirement. Exceptions are the COCC BI 101, BI 102, & BI 103 and the COCC WR 227 courses, which are used both in the major and the Bacc Core, and the OSU ST 351 & ST 352, which can be used towards both the major and the CLA BS requirements

- Not all the courses listed are offered each term. Check current schedule for availability.
- It is the student's responsibility to make certain that all prerequisites are met or instructor permission is granted for courses that require one or both of these conditions.
- It is the responsibility of the student to continuously audit his/her program for successful completion of requirements.
- No Psychology courses can be used in the Bacc Core or CLA Core.

B.S. 15 hours in science, computer science and quantitative studies		15	The CLA B.S. degree requirement is a 15-credit block of science, computer science and quantitative studies as follows: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Computer Science (3-4 credits), and 2) Any course from the College of Science except math or statistics (3-4 credits), and 3) One of the following (8 - 12 credits): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Any 8 credits of departmentally approved ST courses, 4 credits of which must be at the 300-level or above (8 credits) (covered in the Major Requirements) <p>Courses used to satisfy the B.S. requirements may not also be used to satisfy baccalaureate core requirements. Many departments require specific courses to satisfy this set of requirements, consult your academic adviser for details.</p>

IMPORTANT NOTE: No course may be used to meet more than one requirement. Minor courses are the only exception. They can be used for core requirements and minor.
